

FER LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

The Family Engagement in Research (FER) Leadership Academy is a 10-week online course that includes weekly live online group discussions and an individual project (FER Leadership Plan and Elevator Pitch). The course is led by four mentors including researchers and family leaders with a maximum of 12 learners per cohort. Individual and small group mentorship is central to the Leadership Academy.

The overarching aim of the FER
Leadership Academy is to be a
springboard for future family
engagement leadership development
in Canada. Specifically, the objective is
to develop family and research leaders who
advocate, inform, and support organizational
and community efforts to engage families
in neurodevelopmental and child health
research and practice.

COURSE GOALS

CREATE A COHORT OF FAMILY PARTNERS & RESEARCHERS WHO ARE:

- Invested in building leadership and promoting family engagement as a priority at an organizational and/or community level.
- Knowledgeable about the core competencies for family engagement leadership and ready to apply these competencies and mentor others.
- Capable and confident to implement current best practices in family engagement at an organizational and community level.

COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES

UPON COMPLETION OF THIS COURSE, LEARNERS WILL BE ABLE TO:

- Identify and describe the core competencies (i.e., selfawareness, compassion and empathy, communication, advocacy, and entrepreneurship) of a family engagement leader.
- Create a Leadership Learning Plan to map strengths and areas of growth to build and strengthen FER leadership skills.
- Define and describe equity, inclusion, and diversity and apply these concepts in an institutional context of FER.
- Examine aspects of identity that afford team members more/less privilege and power when engaging in research.
- Understand how to implement FER at different levels of leadership (individual, research, organization, community, policy).
- Communicate ideas related to FER leadership verbally and in writing.
